# CONCERNING TAXATION OF CERTAIN GOODS, SERVICES, ACTIVITIES AND OTHER ADMINISTRATIVE FEES

WHEREAS	as part of its activities, it is the Municipality's responsibility to regularly receive, process
	and review requests that demand an allocation of time and resources so as to maintain an
	outstanding quality level in the conclusions it is required to pass on:

WHEREAS	the majority of requests will result in the amendment of one or more urban planning by-
	laws:

WHEREAS	it is within the Municipality's authority to adopt any by-law designed to ensure proper
	financial management and whereas, in order to finance this activity, it intends to adopt a
	pricing model based on the "user pays" principle, meaning to benefit those who request
	it·

WHEREAS	the Municipality has not revised its rates for many years and given the current economic
	context, it is necessary to adjust and consolidate the rates for Municipality services, as
	authorized by sections 244.1 et seq. of the Act respecting municipal taxation (RLRQ, c. F-
	2.1), as well as to provide for the collection terms and conditions:

WHEREAS	the Municipality also wishes to invoke article 962.1 of the Quebec Municipal Code
	(hereinafter CMQ), which allows it to set out by by-law the administrative fees it will
	charge, including those required whon a naymont is refused

	charge, including those required when a payment is refused.	
WHEREAS	a convocation notice was issued in accordance with the Law.	

WHEREAS	a notice of motion of the present by-law was issued at the regular meeting held on April
	8 2025, and a draft hy-law was introduced at the same meeting:

WHEREAS	the members of the Municipal Council declare, in accordance with the Quebec Municipal
	Code (RLRQ, c. C-27.1), that they have received a copy of the said draft by-law no later
	than two (2) legal days prior to the present meeting:

the Council members declare that they have read said by-law and renounced its reading;

THEREFORE, IT IS PROPOSED BY COUNCILLOR ISABELLE BRISSON AND RESOLVED THAT THE PRESENT BY-LAW NUMBER 2025-02-200 BE ADOPTED AND THAT IT BE STATUED AND DECREED AS FOLLOWS:

#### ARTICLE 1 PREAMBLE

The preamble is an integral element of the present by-law.

#### ARTICLE 2 DEFINITIONS

Unless the context indicates otherwise, definitions are:

Membership: agreement or payment for the use of a good, service or activity offered

by the Municipality. In all cases, the membership has a fixed start and end

date. It can be annual, seasonal or one-off.

Adult: any natural person aged 18 or over;
Senior: any natural person aged 55 or over;

Year: based on a calendar year running from January 1 to December 31

**Deposit:** an amount of money collected as a guarantee of total or partial payment

for a good, service, activity or damage that may occur to property belonging to the Municipality and that may be confiscated as total or

partial payment for said good, service or damage.

Family: group of people belonging to the same household and having their

residence at the same main address, which must be located within the

Municipality of Grenville-sur-la-Rouge.

Resident: a natural person whose principal residence is within the territory of the

Municipality of Grenville-sur-la-Rouge.

**Recognized organization:** recognized under any other municipal by-law.

#### ARTICLE 3 PURPOSE AND ENFORCEMENT

The adoption of this by-law has the effect of repealing and amending the following provisions and regulations:

- Repealing by-law RA-208-03-2021 (fee payable for certain municipal services).
- Repealing by-laws R-92-12 and R-92 (fees payable for services provided by the municipal services of the Municipality of Grenville-sur-la-Rouge) and their amendments.
- Repealing by-law RA-502-02-2023 (fee payable for fire safety services for non-resident vehicle fire interventions) and its amendments.
- Amending by-law RA-121-01-2023 by repealing Articles 5.6, 5.17, 8.2C, and APPENDIX A (operation of libraries).
- Repealing by-law R-70 regarding the installation and placement of civic number identification plates on the territory.
- Repealing by-law R-11-1-09 (by-law on administrative fees for the collection of NSF checks), its amendments, and previous versions.
- Repealing Articles 93, 95, 96, 97, 98, 99, 100, 103, and 102 paragraph 5, Sections 5 and 6 in full of bylaw RU-901-2014 (administrative by-law of urban planning regulations).
- Repealing by-law R-74-0-08 (by-law establishing a fee payable for the celebration of marriages and civil unions).
- Repealing Article 7 of by-law RA-403-05-2022 (access to the municipal dock and boating site in the Calumet sector).
- Repealing by-laws regarding the imposition of a fee payable for the purchase of blue, green, and composting bins.
- Repealing Article 3 of by-law RU-901-03-2017 amending RU-901-2014 (fees payable for permits and certificates of authorization for tourist residences) by integrating it into the present by-law.

Any other contrary or incompatible provisions previously omitted are hereby repealed and replaced by those provided in this by-law.

#### ARTICLE 4 PRICING

Prices shown in the APPENDICES to these by-laws concerning each good, service, activity or administrative fee are payable by any person wishing to benefit from or use said goods, services and/or activities. Applicable taxes are to be added to the amounts in accordance with the regulations.

The APPENDICES form an integral part of the present by-law.

#### ARTICLE 5 UNFORESEEN PRICING

In the event that the Municipality is required to provide a service or perform work not specified in the present by-law, it may require payment at actual cost of the work or services rendered, including the cost of incremental benefits related to labour, an additional 15% in administration fees, as well as any other applicable taxes.

#### ARTICLE 6 PAYMENT TERMS AND DEADLINES

If an application is filed using a deposit form, the form must be accompanied by the applicable fee. In the case of a billable service provided by the Municipality, the amount is payable within 30 days of the invoice date. The annual interest rate for any overdue balance is 15%.

Some terms and conditions for the supply of goods and services are specified in municipal by-laws predating this one and are still valid. New rates can only apply once these agreements have legally expired.

A deposit equal to 50% of the approximate fees to be charged by the Municipality may be required before processing the application when the total is \$100 or more.

Full payment may be required before the document can be produced or sent, if there is a flat fee.

Payment on delivery (COD) may be required regardless of the fees required.

The same applies if the Municipality is required to use courier services. This fee may be required prior to shipping.

#### ARTICLE 7 REFUND

No refunds are issued, and this regardless of the outcome of a request, unless specifically stated in another applicable regulation.

An outstanding debt with a balance (principal and/or interest) of less than two dollars (\$2.00) will be cancelled and any credit balance in excess of two dollars (\$2.00) will not be reimbursed.

#### ARTICLE 8 NO-PAYMENT

The Municipality will initiate action to contact the defendants in the event of No-payment. A verbal notice will be given beforehand, stating the payment deadline. In the event of failure to meet this deadline, a written notice will then be sent in the form of a formal notice with a final legal deadline. If this second notice is refused or if there is no response, the Municipality will initiate legal proceedings to recover the outstanding sums without further notice or communication. Any applicable interest and legal fees will be added to the outstanding balance.

#### ARTICLE 9 COMPLIANCE WITH MUNICIPAL BY-LAWS, POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Any person who uses the goods and services offered by the Municipality must comply with the terms, obligations and conditions established by the Municipality to have access to them. In order to ensure this, the Municipality authorizes the municipal authorities to decide whether or not to offer goods or services to any person who fails to comply with these regulations, as long as the person has not rectified the situation or assumed the costs required to do so.

#### ARTICLE 10 EFFECTIVE DATE

This by-law comes into effect in accordance with the Law.
