The onset of winter marks a pause in our major projects. This summer, despite the high temperatures, public works employees were busy. Municipal informations



Public works report - summer 2025

Blue-collar workers have been working hard this summer to improve the safety and longevity of our municipal infrastructure. Here are some notable accomplishments from the season:

- Digging several kilometers of ditches to improve drainage and prevent erosion;
- Replacing culverts on Rawcliff, Kilmar, and Rivière-Rouge roads to improve stormwater flow;
- Blasting and stabilizing embankments to secure road rights-of-way during snow removal;
- Repairing potholes, leveling and refilling roads to improve traffic flow and extend the life of infrastructure;
- Pruning and controlling vegetation to ensure visibility and safety on roads:
- Maintenance of the water system, including replacement of valves and fire hydrants to maintain the reliability of drinking water service;
- · Installation of guardrails;
- · Street marking.

This work demonstrates the professionalism, rigor, and resilience of our teams, who have effectively risen to the challenges in the field, serving the entire community.

Summary of major subsidized projects:

- The repair of Chemin de la Rivière-Rouge at Bell Falls is complete.
- The repair of Harrington Road to Rivington Bridge has been completed;
- The repair of Kilmar Road at Belvédère Road is well underway and will be completed in spring 2026;
- The repair of Kilmar Road at 10th Concession Road is well underway and will be completed in spring 2026.

We have submitted several grant applications and, depending on the grants received, we will inform you of the work that will begin in 2026.

Fire Safety



NEW! Our fire safety department has acquired a battery-powered Jaws of life kit. This technology allows us to respond more quickly and effectively during extrication operations. Every second counts in an emergency, and this improvement gives us the mobility and speed we need to improve our response times and save lives.

For a safe winter, don't forget these simple steps:

- Change the batteries in your smoke detectors
- Have your chimney swept before the cold weather sets in



During winter, the public works department needs everyone's cooperation to ensure snow removal is as quick and safe as possible.

We ask that you:

- Follow parking regulations. Between November 1 and May 1, overnight parking on the streets is prohibited. Parking on the south side of Principale Street is prohibited at all times.
- Do not place your collection bins on the road, but at the edge of your property.
- Do not push snow onto municipal roads.

We ask that you show respect and patience to the workers who clear our roads. If you have any complaints, please do not intercept the snowplow operators. Instead, contact the Public Works Department at (819) 242-8762 #1.
