



SUMMARY OF THE COUNCIL MEETING OF JULY 14, 2026

The summary below has no legal value. In the event of any discrepancy between this information and the official minutes, the latter shall prevail.

GENERAL MANAGEMENT AND CLERK'S OFFICE

Contract Award – Culvert Supplies

Council repealed and replaced Resolution 2026-06-220 to correct an administrative error regarding the identification of the selected supplier. The contract for the supply and delivery of 2,400 mm culverts for urgent work on Avoca Road was confirmed to Wolseley Canada Inc. in the amount of \$52,443.45 plus taxes, compared with a bid of \$68,000 submitted by Armtec. This work is required following heavy rainfall that caused significant damage to the municipal road network.

Affordable Housing

The Municipality joined La Clé d'Argenteuil as a municipal member to support its mission of developing and operating housing intended primarily for low and moderate income households and people with special housing needs. The Mayor was designated as the municipal representative to the organization.

HUMAN RESOURCES

Employment Confirmation

Council confirmed the permanent appointment of Ms. Christine Amyot-Cantin as Administrative Assistant for Urban Planning, Environment and Administration following her probation period.

Appointment

Council appointed Mr. Daniel Reeves to the position of Public Works Operator. Mr. Sébastien Paris may provide replacement services as needed.

PUBLIC WORKS AND TECHNICAL SERVICES

Several contracts were awarded:

- Paul-Bougie Park rink boards: contract awarded to Permafib for supply, delivery and installation, \$46,526.65 plus taxes.

- Abrasive sand 2026-2027: contract awarded to Asphalte et Pavage RF for 6,500 metric tonnes, \$156,744.81 plus taxes.
- Municipal pavement assessment: contract awarded to Trifide, \$8,417.02 plus taxes.
- Paving work: contract awarded to Asphalte et Pavage RF for various sites, \$40,488.05 plus taxes including contingency.
- Sports lighting at Paul-Bougie Park: contract awarded to R. Prévost Ltd., \$59,157.60 plus taxes.

URBAN PLANNING AND ENVIRONMENT

Urban Planning Projects (PIIA)

Three projects were approved:

- exterior renovation at 2850 Route 148;
- renovation and expansion at 3051 Route 148;
- renovation and expansion at 15 Rue du Centre in the Calumet sector.

Toponymy

Council approved the names:

- “Rue du Sentier-du-Loup” and “Rue de l’Original-Blanc” for the Original Blanc integrated development project;
- “Chemin des Horizons” for a development in the Panorama sector;
- “Chemin des Durand” for a private road located near Highway 50.

Residential Development

Council authorized the signing of an agreement concerning municipal works required for the Pine Hill Phase V residential project. Required infrastructure will be completed at the developer’s expense.

BY-LAWS

Council adopted several by-laws, including the code of ethics for municipal employees, speed limits, the toponymy committee’s governance rules, and access to the Calumet boat launch. Notices and draft by-laws regarding contract management and detached accessory dwelling units were also adopted.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Financial assistance was granted to the Lac McGillivray Community Association (\$900) and Rouge Valley Days (\$2,500).

QUESTION PERIOD

Road Safety

Following a citizen request, Council will ask the Ministry of Transportation and Sustainable Mobility to allow the installation of two educational radar signs in the Pointe-au-Chêne sector to encourage compliance with speed limits and improve road safety.
